Expeditious disposal of Court Cases against Govt. in High Court and Tribunal.

Sir,

It has come to the notice of the Department that cases filed against Govt. in High Court and Tribunal are not managed effectively at the District level for which Govt. has to face embarrassment. It is learnt that PWCs are not submitted in the A.G office in High Court and in the office of the Govt. Advocate at OAT for which not only the litigation is prolonged but also loses cases in default.

In the view of the above you are directed to take a review of the cases where PWCs has not been submitted as per following points:-

- 1. Chalking out year wise / court wise pendency of cases in your District.
- 2. Preparation of the list of cases where PWC has not been submitted.
- **3.** Entrusting the responsibility of filing of the PWC on the Nodal officer of the District.

In those cases where it will be revealed that para wise comments have not been submitted should be taken as priority for submission of para wise comments within one month.

In-spite of above instructions, if Govt. loses the case by default then person liable for such lapses will be held responsible. In case of financial implications the amount will be recovered from the person concerned.
